The Oregon Country Fair is a nonprofit, year-round philanthropic organization. Each year, the Oregon Country Fair holds a 3-day fundraiser on 300 acres along the Long Tom River featuring some of the finest music, crafts and artisans in the country. The Oregon Country Fair provides grants, sponsors events and supports numerous local non-profits, as well as offering its own youth camp, Culture Jam. The Oregon Country Fair strives to honor community diversity, care for the earth, art and performance, as well as create participatory experiences for youth and elders, and develop a healthy spirit of volunteerism. KOFC is a low power FM radio station serving the Fern Ridge Communities of Veneta, Noti, Elmira, Western Eugene and surrounding areas. On the air since July, 2015, KOFC provides local programming 24 hours a day 372 days a year. As an integral part of the community KOFC gives local organizations and communities an opportunity to offer information relevant to their neighbors. The station has forged a relationship with community leaders and organizations that help foster the growth and connections in these local areas. KOFC also streams globally from kocf.org and can be heard on any type of device anywhere on the planet, and beyond.

About the WOW Hall

The W.O.W. Hall is owned and operated by the Community Center for the Performing Arts, a nonprofit organization dedicated to: Providing cultural arts and educational opportunities for all ages and income levels, Preserving and operating the historic Woodmen of the World Hall as a multipurpose community arts center, and Maintaining a supportive environment for local artists and their creative efforts.

The CCPA is a democratic organization where members elect and may serve on the volunteer board of directors. Members are kept informed with the monthly WOW Hall Notes (available by mail or e-mail) and are invited to celebrate each December at the annual WOW Hall Membership Party which features food and beverages donated by many of Lane County's best restaurants and suppliers.

The W.O.W. Hall is a safe and friendly meeting place for the community, a place for appreciation of the arts for everyone, and a training ground for new generations. Local, regional, national and international acts frequently grace the stage, and the Hall prides itself on its diversity. The Hall is also used for classes, workshops, lectures, meetings, rehearsals and recording sessions. Each month the Lobby Art Gallery displays the work of a different local artist.

About Terrapin Flyer

This is the 20th Anniversary of Terrapin Flyer. Terrapin Flyer is a Chicago based Grateful Dead band that has performed in Eugene annually since 2015 at Wow Hall with Melvin Seals from the Jerry Garcia Band and have been joined by original Merry Pranksters Ken Babbs and George Walker. No two Terrapin Flyer shows will ever be the same and you never know who might show up to jam at a show, but you can always count on a great time with some of the most recognized artists in the music community. At this show they will be joined by keyboardist Scott Guberman from Phil Lesh and Friends and Josh Olken on lead guitar.
